
#### **Amputee fetishism**


# Amputee fetishism in Literature


## **Schediaphilia** (aka toonophilia) sexual attraction to cartoon or anime characters.








## Galactophilia: (a.k.a *lactophilia*) sexual attraction to human milk or lactating women

## Urolagnia (also known as urophilia or undinism) sexual pleasure from urine & urination.


Havelock Ellis - British sexologist who was aroused by seeing women urinate.


Suggested Rembrandt also enjoyed the practice, claiming it explained the golden tones of his paintings.



Voyeurism: sexual pleasure from observing other people.








### Zoophilia

### Necrophilia

A sexual attraction to corpses.

Figuratively, the term "necrophilia" describes an inordinate desire to control another person.



#### Legality in the United States

As of May, 2006, there is no federal legislation specifically barring sex with a corpse.

Multiple states have their own laws:

- Alabama Class C felony
- Alaska Class A misdemeanor
- Arkansas Class D felony
- California Illegal, up to 8 years in prison
- Colorado Class 2 misdemeanor
- Delaware Class A misdemeanor
- <u>Florida</u>-- Second degree felony
- Georgia Felony, up to 10 years in prison
- Hawaii Misdemeanor
- Michigan Class A felony; life in prison
- Oregon Felony for "Abuse of Corpse"
- <u>Pennsylvania</u> Second degree misdemeanor
- Washington Class C Felony for "Sexually violation human remains"
- Minnesota and Nevada also have laws prohibiting necrophilia
